### Life Cycle

On 3 October 2022, the LifeCycle (Malta) Foundation donated €25,000 to the University of Malta's Research, Innovation and Development Trust (RIDT) in support of current research to determine the underlying genetic defects in patients with polycystic kidney disease in Malta and Gozo, the most commonly inherited kidney disorder and a significant cause of end-stage renal disease.

A cheque was presented to Professor Alfred Vella, Rector of the University of Malta, by Alan Curry, Founder of the LifeCycle (Malta) Foundation, and Chairperson Dr Shirley Cefai in the presence of representatives of Nescafé the main sponsor of this year's challenge, members of the University of Malta research team and RIDT CEO Wilfred Kenely.

The research programme is being run by the Department of Anatomy within the Faculty of Medicine & Surgery in collaboration with the Department of Pathology at Mater Dei Hospital. The LifeCycle (Malta) Foundation raises funds in support of patients suffering from kidney failure and covers three principle areas: awareness, treatment and research. To achieve this, the foundation works with the medical staff at the Renal Unit in Mater Dei Hospital, the University of Malta and RIDT.

Over the past few months, the Research Trust has embarked on a systematic outreach campaign using different media platforms.
