

Human presence in Malta earlier than previously thought

Mediterranean Hunter Gatherers Navigated Long-Distance Sea Journeys Well Before the First Farmers

In a paper published in the acclaimed international research journal Nature on Wednesday 9 April 2025, new evidence shows that hunter-gatherers were crossing at least 100 kilometers (km) of open water to reach the Mediterranean island of Malta 8,500 years ago, a thousand years before the arrival of the first farmers. This report documents the oldest true long-distance seafaring in the Mediterranean, before the invention of boats with sails – an astonishing feat for hunter-gatherers likely using simple dugout canoes.


The RIDT Giving Back Campaign
