#### **Tribute to Professor Alex Felice**

The RIDT pays its respects to Prof. Alex Felice, a great supporter and friend who passed away in November. He was widely known as a devoted scientist, pioneering researcher, curious mind, and free thinker, with a strong belief in humanity and the young generation, many of whom he mentored and guided.

Prof. Felice was a pioneer in bringing science to the public and encouraging collaboration among scientists. He was a co-founder and first President of the Malta Chamber of Scientists (1992). He also helped establish the National Alliance for Rare Diseases Malta and the Euro Biobank. In 2012, he co-created the "Science in the City" festival with Dr Edward Duca and Wilfred Kenely, which is now an annual meeting point for scientists, artists, and the public. He authored numerous scientific publications, primarily focusing on blood and its disorders.

Prof. Felice was particularly supportive of the RIDT's work. He strongly believed in community support for university research, particularly after having studied and practiced in the USA, where such a culture is strong. Along with his wife, Joanna, he frequently attended our events, providing valuable ideas, leads, and contacts, while encouraging outreach programmes that celebrated research. The RIDT is indebted to him for his integrity, his continued support and unwavering commitment to the scientific community.



## **ALIVE Charity Foundation surpasses 1 Million euro for Cancer Research**

The **ALIVE Charity Foundation** held its Awards Night on Saturday 22 November 2025 at Ta' Betta Wine Estates, bringing together past and present cyclists, supporters, and partners to celebrate another successful year of fundraising for cancer research. Awards were presented to long-time partners and the main sponsors of the 2025 Cycling Challenge.

During the event, ALIVE announced that it has now reached €1.1 million in funds donated to cancer research at the University of Malta through RIDT — exceeding the Foundation's original €1 million target set in 2013. This year's ALIVE contribution to cancer research reached the record sum of €180,000.








## The APS Valletta Campus Nights

## Europa Donna Malta donates more funds for breast cancer research






## The Royal Opera House - a new publication supported by the RIDT

#### LIDL Malta supports skin cancer research


